- 1) North Dakota resident.
- 2) Graduate from a high school in North Dakota, from a high school in a bordering state (according to provisions set forth in ND Century Code 15.1-29), or from a nonpublic high school in a neighboring state while the student resides with a custodial parent in ND.
- 3) Complete the diploma requirements from sections 1-5 and 7 listed on page 1.
- 4) Obtain a grade of at least “C” in each unit **OR** ½ unit required under the Diploma Requirements listed on side one and the specific units required by each respective scholarship.
- 5) Obtain a cumulative grade point of at least “B” on a 4.0 scale in all courses enrolled, or based only on the 22 units required by ND for high school graduation, including specific scholarship course requirements. The GPA must be rounded to the nearest hundredth for eligibility purposes.
- 6) Complete 1 unit of Algebra II.

**ND Career and Technical Education Scholarship Eligibility Requirements**

In addition to the common eligibility requirements listed above, the student must also complete the following:

In addition to the common eligibility requirements listed above, the student must also complete the following:

- 1 unit of Mathematics for which Algebra II is a prerequisite
- 2 units of the same Foreign **OR** Native American Language **OR** American Sign Language
- 1 unit of Fine Arts or Career and Technical Education
- 1 additional unit of a Foreign **OR** Native American language, Fine Arts, **OR** Career and Technical Education
- Receive a composite score of at least 24 on the ACT (*Deadline is the February ACT national test date from senior year*)
- 1 unit of an AP course and examination, or ½ unit Dual Credit Course
