



Clarification on the Use of Title I Aides/Paraprofessionals

Under the *No Child Left Behind Act*, there are several new regulations concerning the job duties assigned to Title I Aides/Paraprofessionals.

In order to provide clarification on the allowable job duties or time designated to Title I Aides/Paraprofessionals, please see the questions listed below.

Can another teacher (i.e. LD, Library, Classroom teacher) design the lessons and have the Title I Aide/Paraprofessional deliver the lesson to Title I students?

Can the Title I Teacher deliver Title I Reading services and the Title I Aide/Paraprofessional deliver the Title I Math services?

Can the Title I Teacher provide Elementary Title I services and the Title I Aide/Paraprofessional provide the Middle School and/or High School Title I services?

So...What can a Title I Aide/Paraprofessional do?

A Title I aide, under the direct supervision of a Title I teacher, can provide one-on-one tutoring services for an eligible student, only when a student would not receive instruction from a teacher. A certified Title I teacher is responsible for the caseload of all identified Title I students.
