

Professional Development Opportunity for General Educators: Special Education and Secondary Transition: What is the General educator's Role?

The North Dakota Department of Public Instruction and the North Dakota Education Association requested and received a Collaborative Professional Development and Adult Learning Seed Grant from the IDEA Partnership at NASDSE. Through coordinated efforts a Transition Training Module was developed for General Educators. This training module was developed by LeAnn Nelson, NDEA Professional Development Director, Gerry Teevens, NDDPI Secondary Transition Coordinator, Judy Sannes, UND Disability Services Specialist, Steve Arel, General Educator, and Sarah A Anderson, Special Educator. The course was offered June & July 2008 at two college campuses in North Dakota.

This course (training) is designed for regular education, high school teachers to understand what the federal law (the Individual's with Disabilities Act) mandates as their role in the education of students with disabilities and their transition from high school. Topics covered include the role of the general educator, the IDEA 2004 regulations, transition from high school to college or the workforce, classroom strategies and collaboration for students to transition successfully.
